Grand Lake offers a myriad of activities for everyone on and off the water... water sports, boat and jet ski rentals, historic sites, attractions, wildlife, events/festivals, rodeos and more...and plenty of accommodations and dining facilities.

You may begin your Grand Lake tour in **Grove** where you may spend the morning at **Har-Ber Village**, one of the largest antiques museums in the United States. The museum is a turn-of-the-century village with over 100 buildings, each depicting eras long gone.

Take a cool walk through **Lendenwood Gardens** and enjoy their Japanese Tea House surrounded by an oriental garden pond containing over 500 koi fish and three acres of blooming rhododendrons and azaleas.

Your tour is not complete without a tour of the historic **Pensacola Dam** (Memorial Day-Labor Day). The dam is listed on the National Register of Historic Places ... a must see.

If traveling on summer weekends, you can enjoy inspiring entertainment at **The Picture in Scripture Amphitheater** in Disney. It features "The Man Who Ran", the biblical portrayal of Jonah and the Whale. Dinner is available. Remember that the drama is only on Friday and Saturday nights during the summer.

You'll find a winery in nearby **Vinita** as well as the **Vinnie Ream Museum** and events throughout the year. And just north, in **Miami**, **The Coleman Theatre** has been completely refurbished to its original splendor and houses the original and still working, Mighty Wurlitzer. Don't miss this! Route 66 ribbons through these two towns.
