

Tulsa Area

There are many possibilities for a good time in the Tulsa area where you will find world class museums, art galleries or the performing arts. Some museums include the **Philbrook**, the **Gilcrease**, **Sherwin Miller Museum of Jewish Art**, **The Tulsa Air and Space Museum**, and the **Tulsa Zoo**.

The zoo can arrange a general tour of the zoo or can provide one as specific as a botanical tour. Tulsa Zoo is the only zoo with an accredited museum. Special exhibits are on display throughout the year. You can have lunch at the zoo in the restaurant or arrange for a pre-ordered sack lunch for your group.

If shopping is a favorite past time, there's plenty to offer! We have several shopping areas such as **Brookside**, **Utica Square**, **Kingspoint**, **Woodland Hills Mall**, and much more including malls and antique areas. There's something for everyone!

Tulsa also offers sporting events, an array of concert venues, a walking tour of downtown, and more.

Broken Arrow

Broken Arrow is a wonderful "bedroom" community in the Tulsa area and offers several motels with ample bus parking. Known for its great specialty shops from antiques to western wear, its two major golf courses and the **Blue Bell Creamery** – where you can actually watch ice cream being made. Visit their Country store, sample the ice cream, and shop for gift items. A visit to Broken Arrow should also include a stop at the **Bass Pro Shops** and Islamorada Fish Company!

Of course there are a number of wonderful restaurants in the area. You can enjoy steak dinners, tearooms, Italian specialties or home cooking. They can even arrange for box lunches.

Jenks

Jenks is located just south of Tulsa off US 75 and boasts the new **Oklahoma Aquarium**, a new riverfront retail/entertainment area and lots of new restaurants. And that's in addition to the "antique capital of the state" downtown and an excellent **herb festival** in the spring!

Sapulpa

Sapulpa is located just west of Tulsa on Historic Route 66 and your visit should begin with Frankoma Pottery.... arrange a factory tour, wander through the museum and be sure to leave time to visit their gift shop.

Take a walk down Dewey Avenue, Sapulpa's main street where you will find a number of small specialty shops located in the heart of downtown. You will find a store that specializes in a number of collectible lines, a western store with great accessories for you or your home, book store, basket store with wonderful gift ideas. These are just a sample of what you will find there, not to forget an antique mall and a Route 66 memorabilia store.

Include in your visit a trip to the 3-story museum filled with artifacts and information of the history of Creek County primarily focusing on Sapulpa. A full and interesting day can easily be spent here.
